



## BINGO INFORMATION / INSTRUCTIONS

Columbia Soccer Club is a not-for-profit, volunteer organization. It is also one of the few organizations of its kind in the country developing a real estate venture of the magnitude of Pride Park. In order to keep individual player fees low while continuing to pay the physical development costs of Pride Park, the Club operates a large-scale bingo operation every Saturday night in Columbia, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Missouri Gaming Commission. Your signatures below indicate your commitment to provide bingo fundraiser work hours to Columbia Soccer Club for the season indicated on this sheet. It also indicates your commitment to work the Club's major fundraiser, "BINGO."

A **CSC Academy family's** yearly bingo commitment will be one (1) slot; a **CSC Pride family's** yearly bingo commitment will be three (3) slots per player per year. CSC bingo work sessions are **Saturday** nights from **4:00 p.m. to approximately 10:00 p.m.** Each Saturday bingo game is worked by 12-14 volunteers – 8-10 people working the bingo game (including caller, banker, floor sales and window sales) and 4-5 people working the concessions stand. Multiple family members can work the same night, thus covering several bingo commitment slots. **ALL Academy & Pride families** are all required to work 1 ½ hours at each *Columbia Pride Invitational Tournament* (fall & spring). This obligation could include selling t-shirts, working as a field marshal, concessions, etc.

**BINGO-ELIGIBLE** In order to be eligible to work the actual bingo game (caller, banker, floor sales and window sales), according to the rules and regulations of the Missouri Gaming Commission, a member of your family must have been associated with the *Columbia Soccer Club* for the past *two consecutive seasons*. Any family, who has had a member play, coach or has any other involvement with the Columbia Soccer Club's recreational soccer program or competitive program, or any adult or secondary team or league organized or sponsored by or through the Columbia Soccer Club for the past two consecutive seasons is eligible to work bingo. What's more, all immediate family members (parents, players and siblings) who are over the age of 16 are able to work the bingo game. Finally, all bingo game workers **MUST** have their social security numbers on file with Columbia Soccer Club, as mandated by the Missouri Gaming Commission.

**BINGO-INELIGIBLE** If you or any members of your immediate family have not been associated with the Columbia Soccer Club for the past two consecutive seasons, you can work in the concession stand but not in the actual operation of the bingo game. If your family is ineligible, your bingo commitment will usually be fulfilled by working bingo concessions.

**BINGO WORK SCHEDULES** Team managers may request a date to hold for their team to work; otherwise it is first come first serve for the dates you work. ALL families must have one slot worked or scheduled to work by October 1, 2010 and the remaining slots worked or scheduled to work by April 1, 2011. The bingo year runs from July 10, 2010 to July 9, 2011. If family fails to work a scheduled night the player card will be pulled; the player is not allowed to participate in games, until a \$100 forfeit fee is paid to the Club.

**REPLACEMENT WORKERS** In the event that you are unable to work a scheduled bingo work slot, you may, on your own, swap spots with another family in the Club.

**BINGO FUNDRAISER WAIVER** Beginning with the 2007-08 season, families may opt out of the bingo fundraiser by paying a \$300 Bingo Waiver. By choosing this option and paying the waiver fee, your family will be exempt from the bingo fundraiser for the entire season. However, you will still be required to provide work hours during other Club fundraisers, including tournaments and Cosmo Park concessions, as determined by the board of directors. The \$300 waiver applies only to the bingo fundraiser.
